Other opportunities include but are not limited to: Site Selection, Fall Feast, Winter Concert, Spring Concert, Theater productions, Diversity Day, Career Day. Monthly Home & School meetings are utilized to share priorities and initiatives.

PARENT RESPONSIBILITIES:

We, as parents, will:

- Send my child to school healthy, well nourished, clean and prepared to learn.

- See that my child is punctual and attends school every day.
- Support the school's discipline policy.
